Monday through Thursday he spends 1 1/2 hours learning English with the hope of one day studying abroad in the United States. As a condition of the scholarship, Luis must maintain a 90% average in his studies at school. Upon the completion of the second quarter, Luis fell short of that threshold. Thankfully, he was given a grace period to improve his grades. Recently, Luis received his latest quarterly report card and, we are so happy to share, he scored a 93%. Well done Luis!

#### Geraldine

is 12 years old and came to Talita Cumi a year and a half ago with her two younger brothers. When they arrived, all of them were completely uneducated. Even though Geraldine had to start from level zero, she put in a lot of effort and learned at a rapid pace. We are ecstatic to share that she recently earned the highest grades in her class of 35 students! She scored a 94%. In the home, Geraldine has a sweet and gentle disposition and gets along well with the Talita Cumi team and the other children.

Among other life factors, this process takes quite the emotional toll on Mariel and she often spirals downward after the visits: neglecting to wash her clothes, sleeping all day, and refusing to get out of bed or help around the home. Please pray that Mariel would find peace and consolation in Jesus and that the Talita Cumi team could guide her with wisdom and patience.

ROSARIO (9years old) is a very bright girl with an astounding memory-she never seems to forget anything she has learned. Please pray for her. She is given to constant stealing and lying-habits that were a form of survival when she was younger.
